Do you live in District 41? = Yes

In 2018, the District will pay off the bonds that funded past building projects. As a result, the District will be nearly debt free. **This reduction of debt payments would give the community an opportunity to invest \$42 million to update our schools with no increase over the taxes paid in 2016.** The cost to address all of the needs identified in the survey would exceed \$60 million. In order to fund major building projects, voters would need to support a referendum to issue bonds, which would be paid back over 20 years.

What referendum amount would you support, assuming the projects included were acceptable to you?

Example: If a community member pays \$8,000 in taxes and voters support a \$40 million referendum, their total tax bill would decrease by \$16 (8 X -\$2 = -\$16) over the current level.
