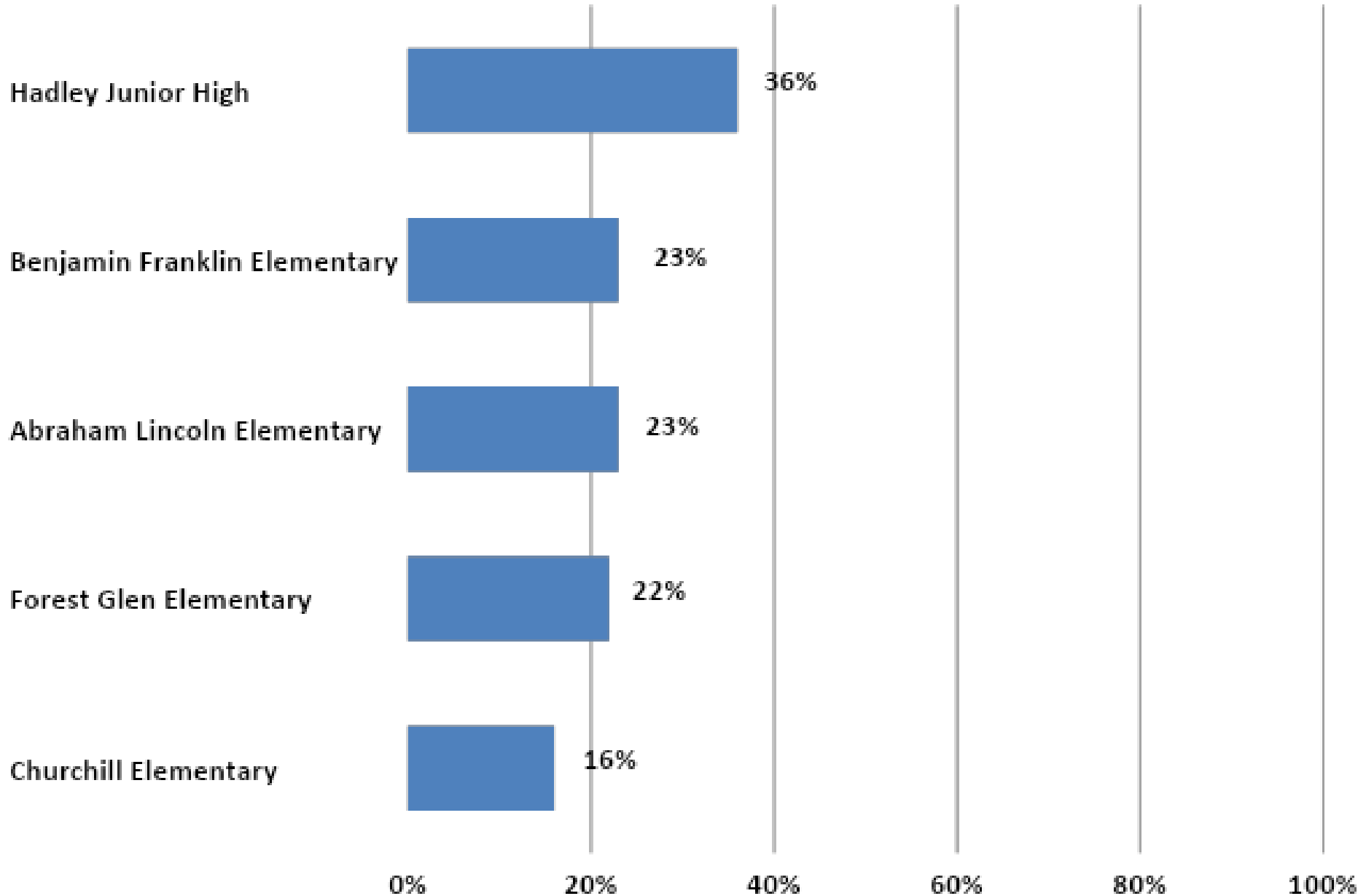

Survey Summary

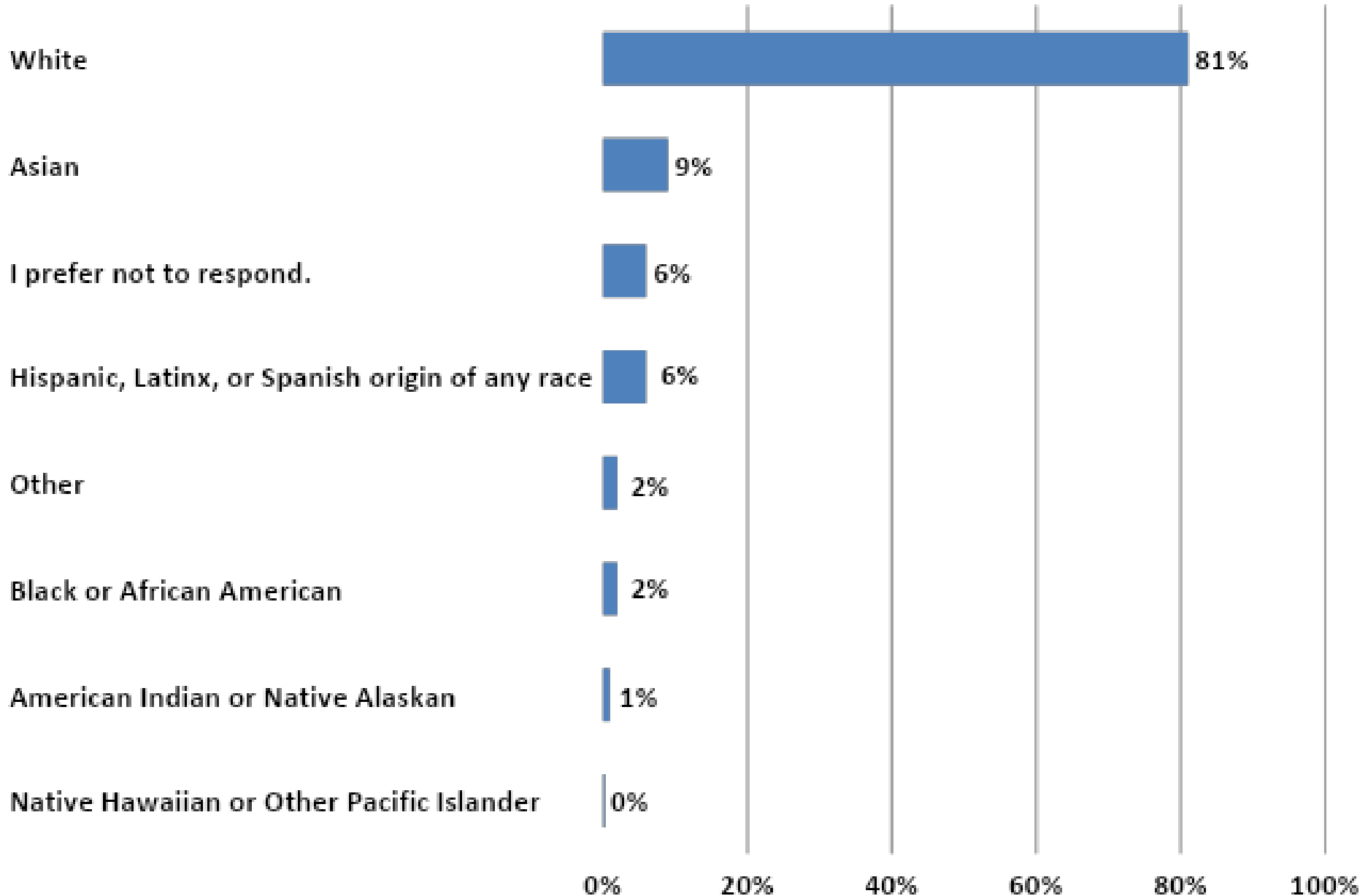
- The survey was conducted in mid-May – early June of 2021.

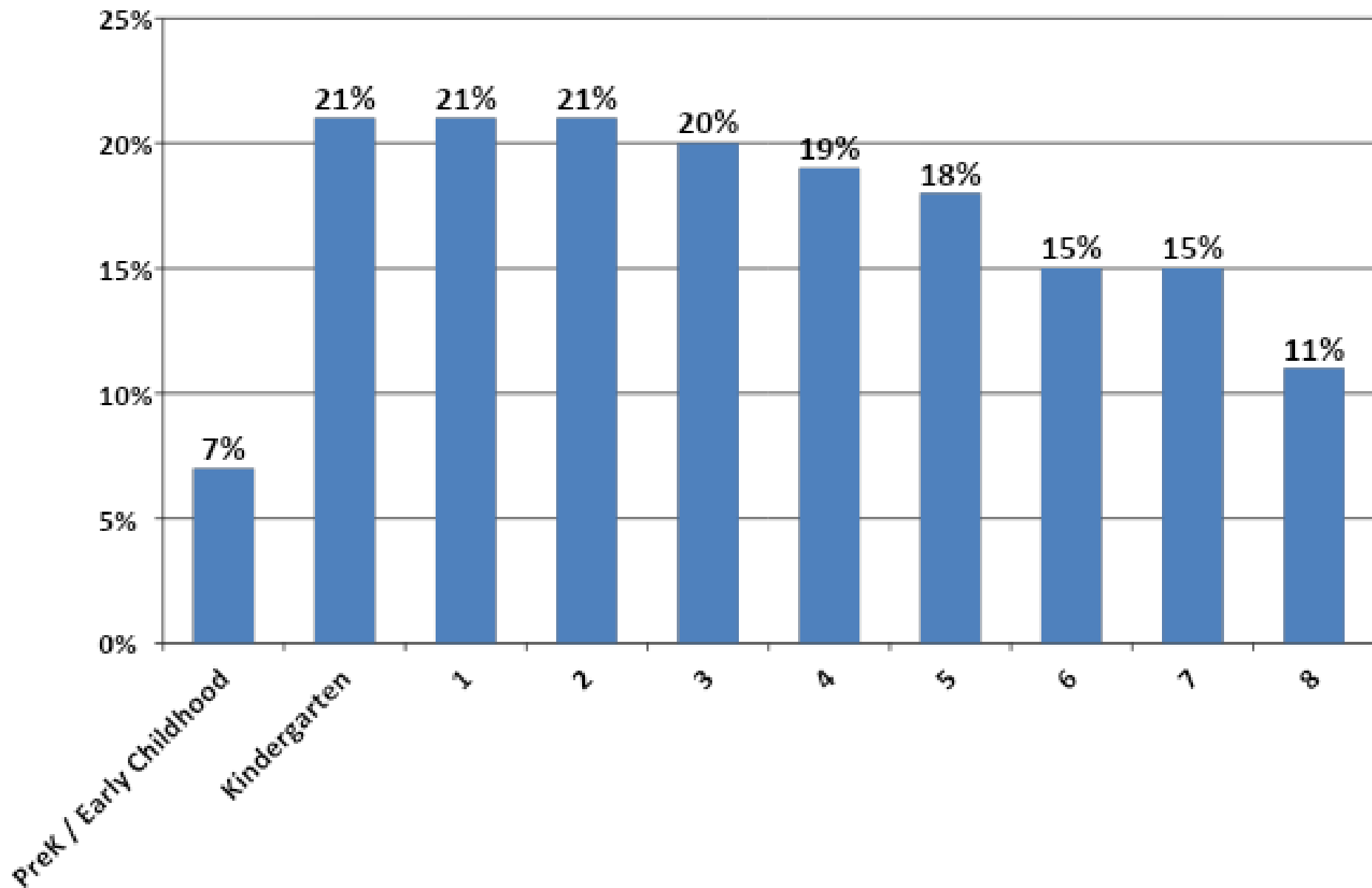
Which schools do your children attend?

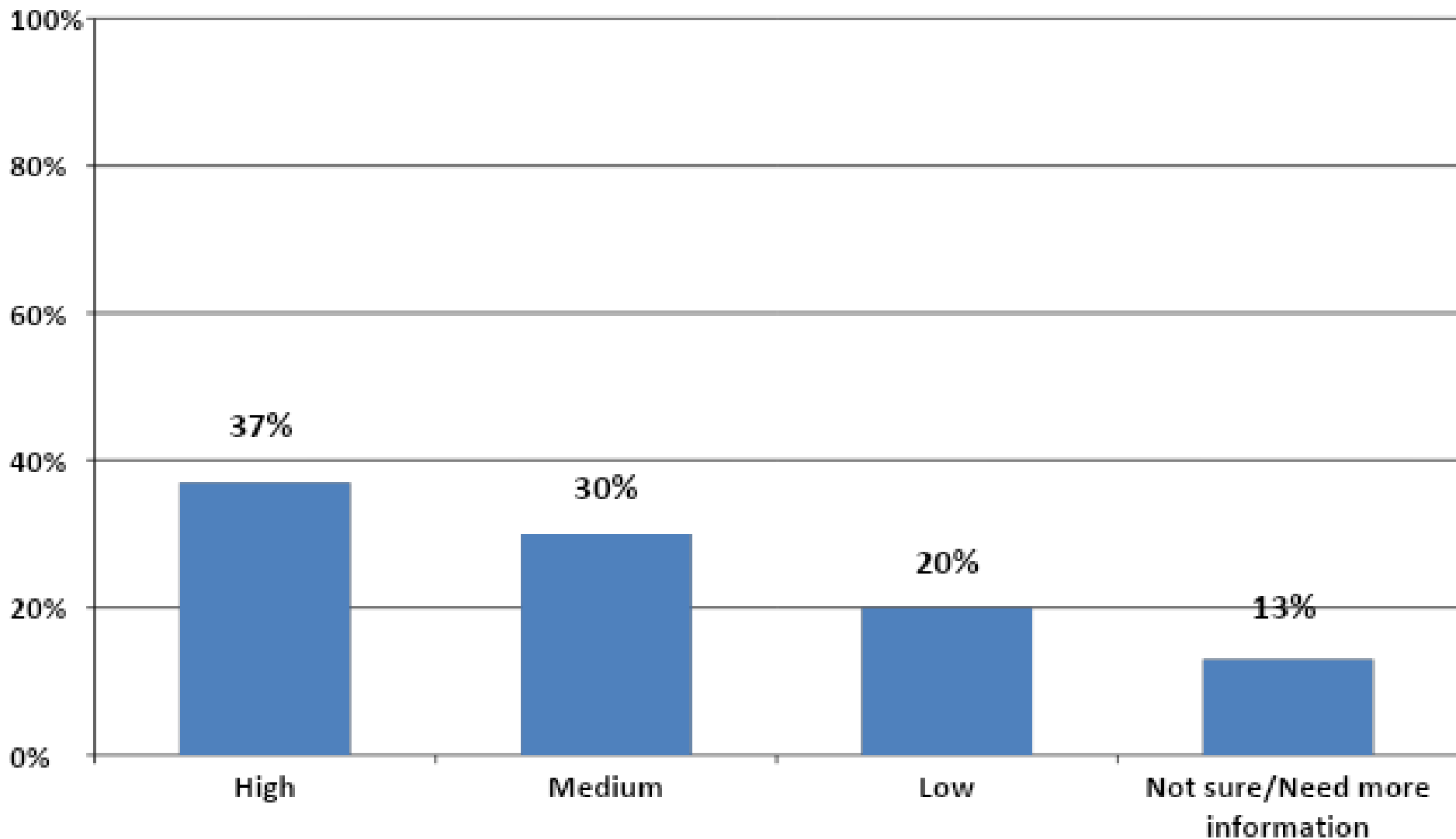

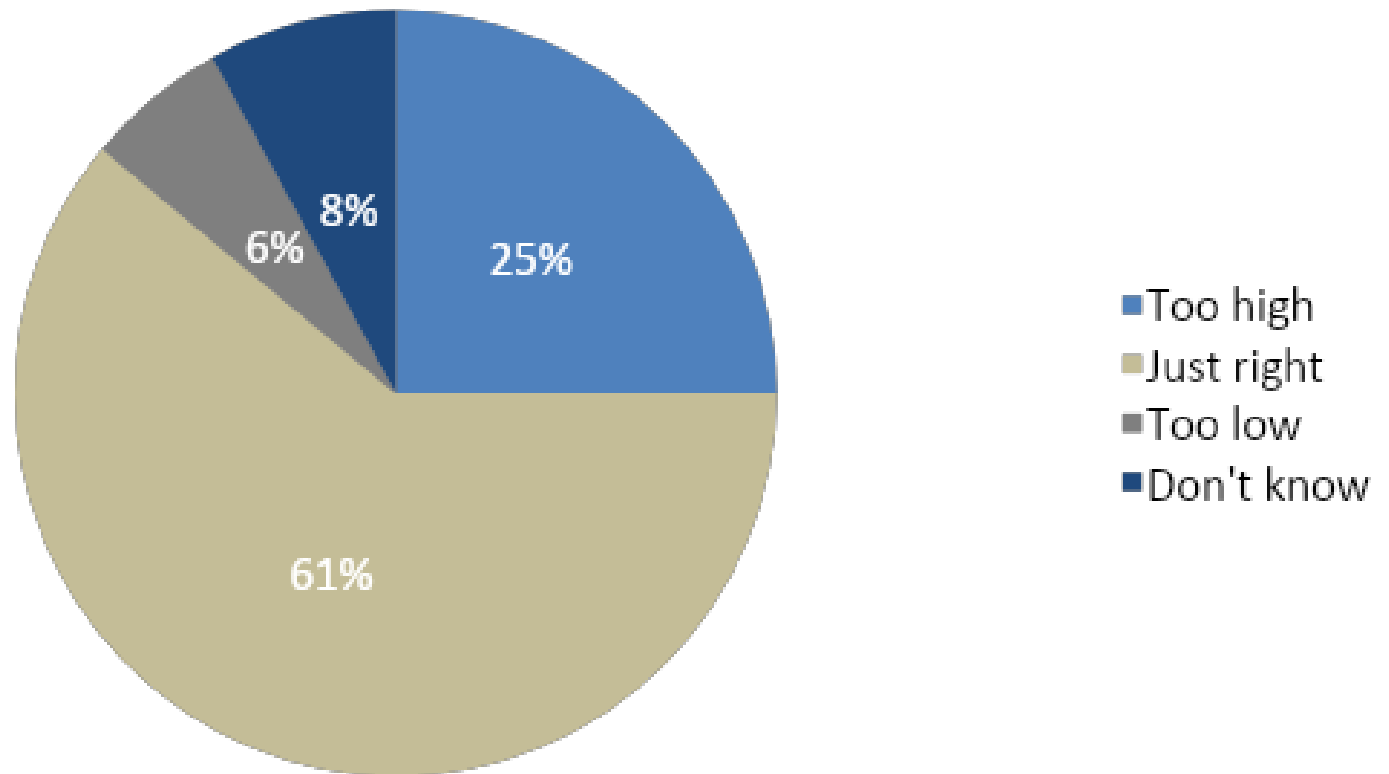

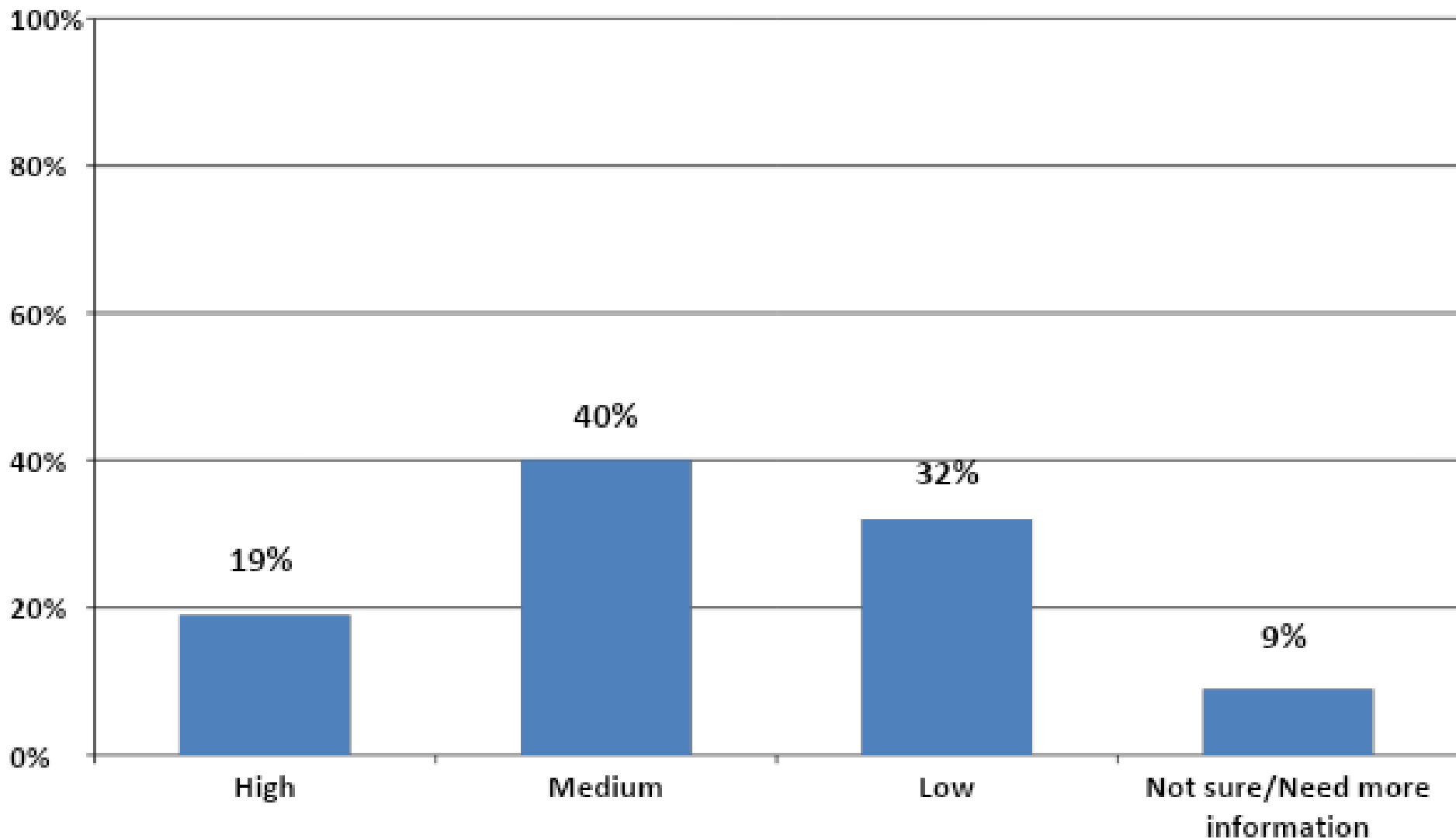

The overall use of technology at my child's school is:

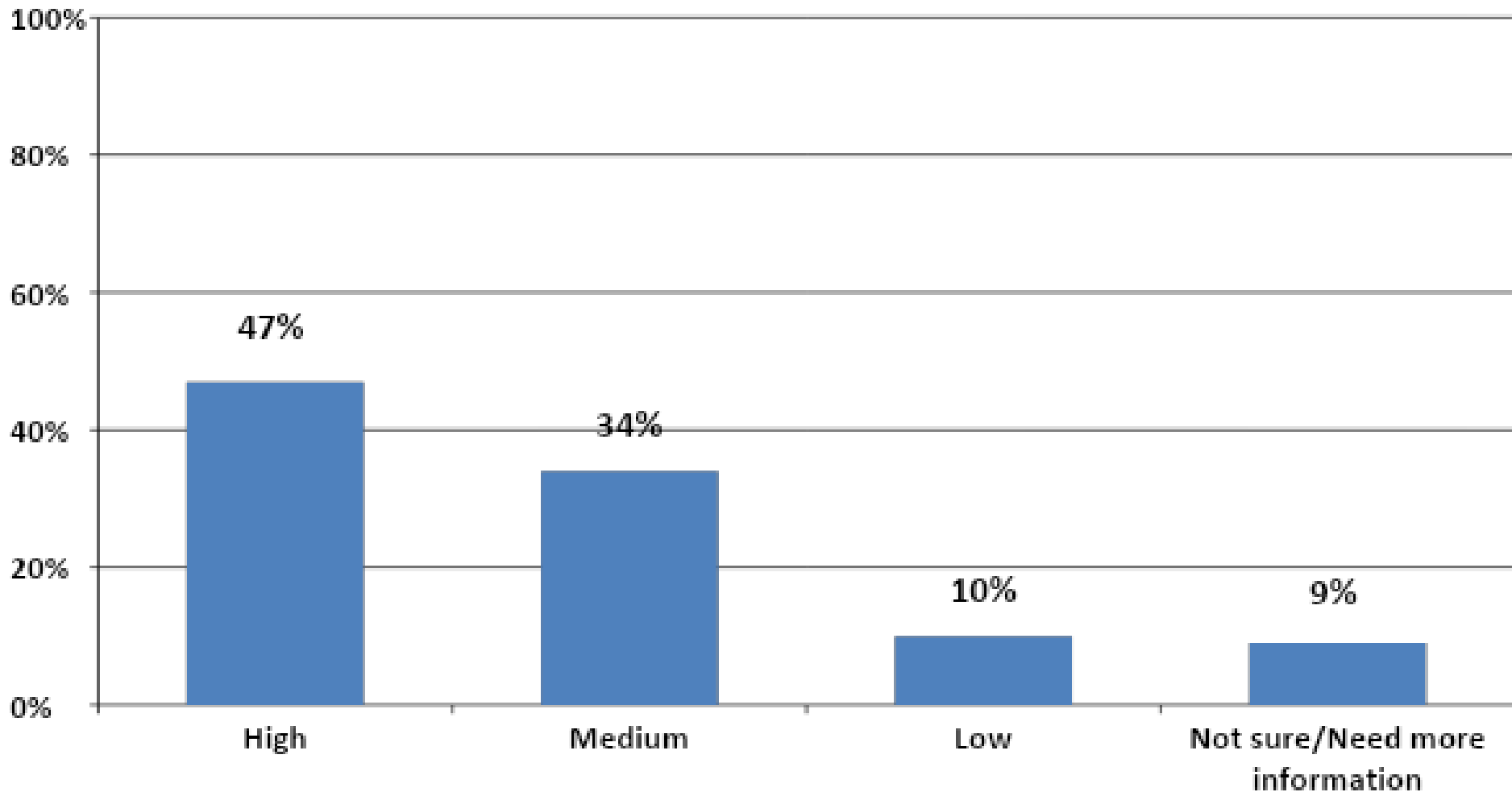


What priority would you place on integrating more technology in our teaching strategies?

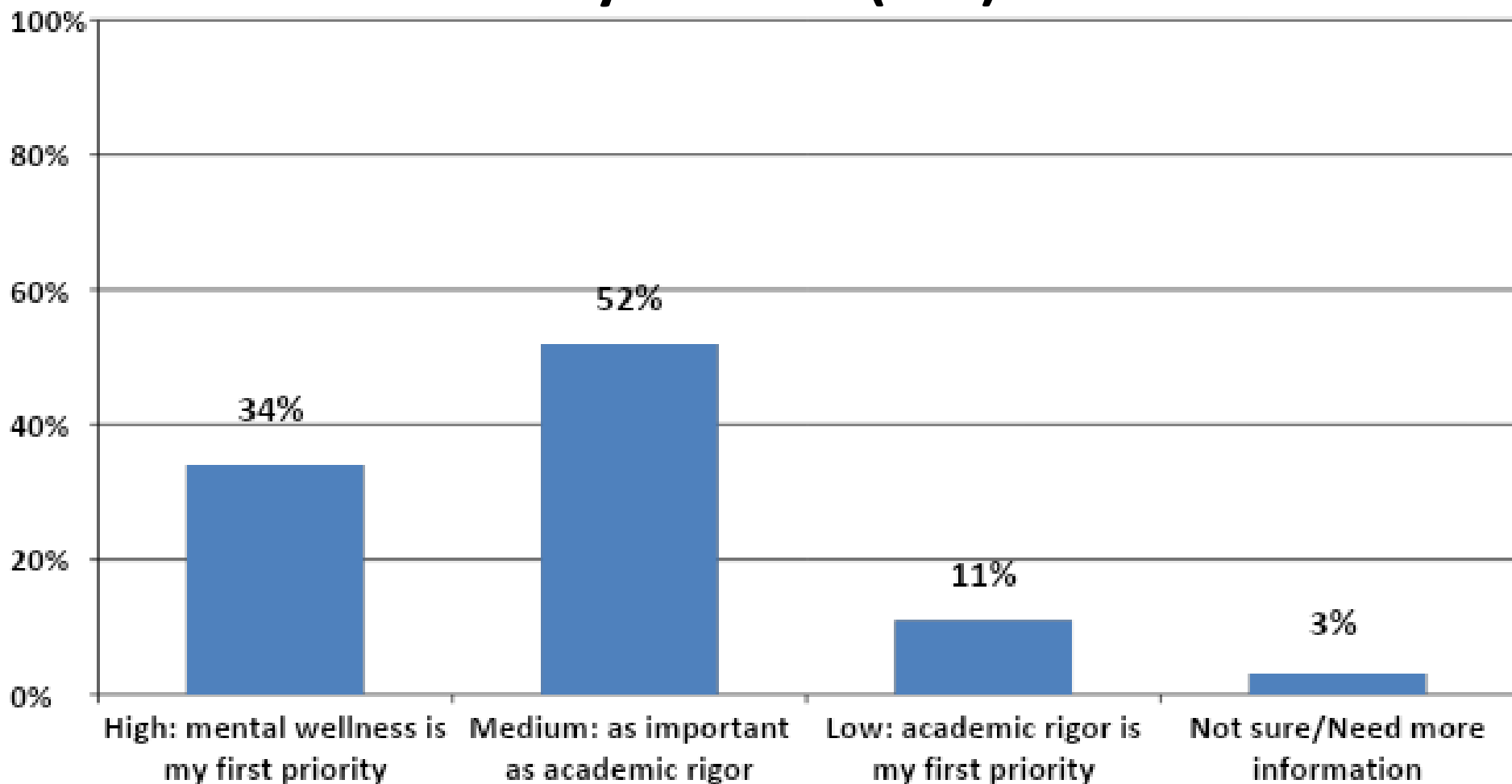
What priority would you place on integrating more Problem-Based Learning strategies in our curriculum?

Full-Day Kindergarten

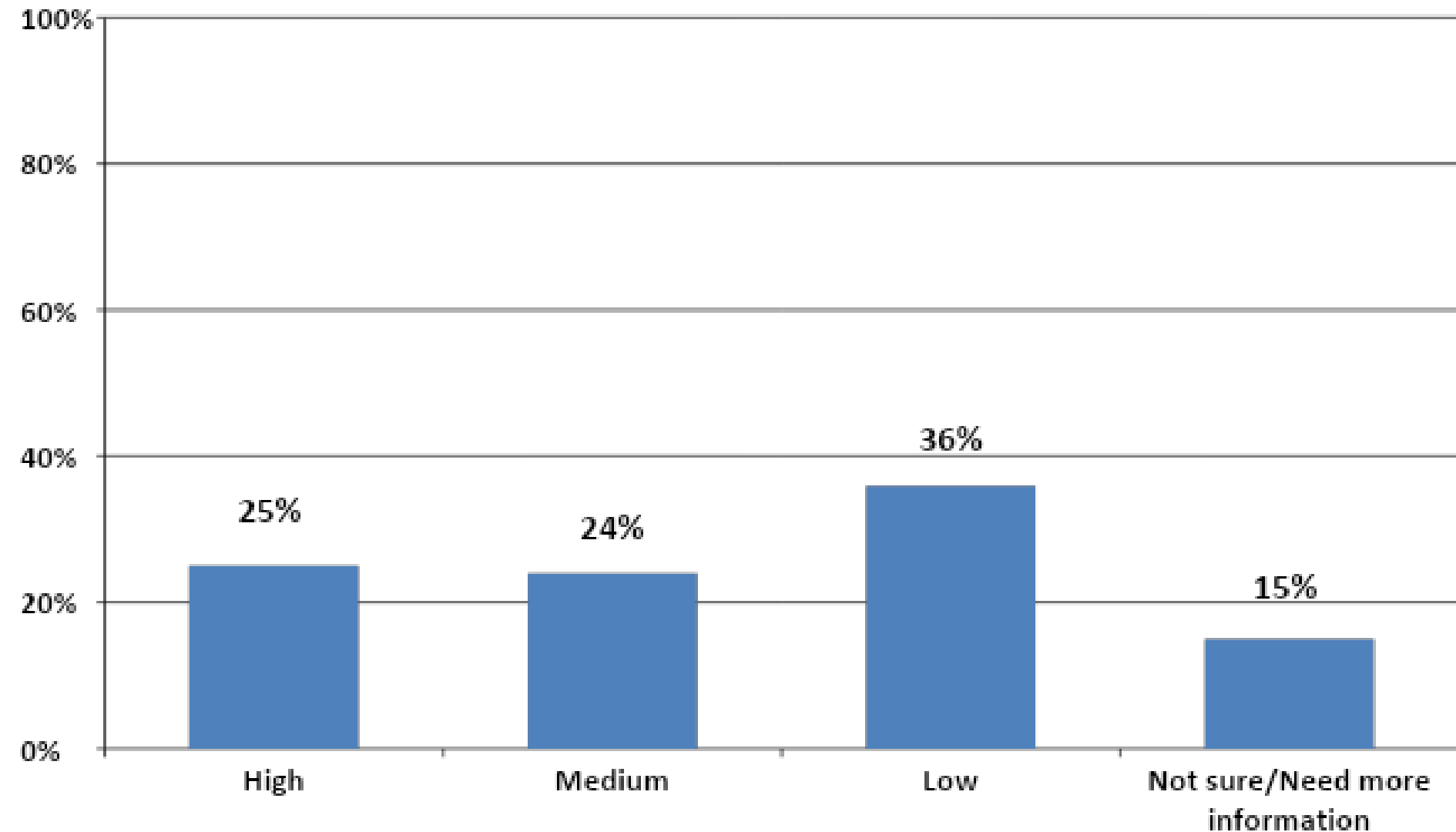
The majority of the Glenbard High School District feeder school districts and local private schools offer full-day kindergarten.

The District does not have the space needed to offer full-day kindergarten at each school and, therefore, would need to offer it at an alternative location.
